AMENDED NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Description of the Requested Action: The New Mexico Environment Department (“Department”) will hold a hybrid public hearing to consider the matter of the amended application (“Amended Application”) by Universal Waste Systems, Inc. (“Applicant”) for the Broadway Transfer Station (“BTS”). The Amended Application for a solid waste facility permit has been reviewed by the Resource Recovery Bureau of the Department for compliance with the New Mexico Solid Waste Act (“Act”), NMSA 1978, Sections 74-9-1 through 74-9-43 (1990, amended 2011), the New Mexico Solid Waste Rules, 20.9.2 through 20.9.10 NMAC, and the Secretary’s Order dated October 3, 2024, requiring a Community Impact Assessment and providing for additional public involvement. The Applicant seeks to obtain a solid waste facility permit for 20 years. Having received the Amended Application on December 31, 2025, the Department deemed it complete on February 16, 2026.

Description of Permit Application: BTS is a new solid waste transfer station located at 5520 Broadway Blvd. SE, Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, New Mexico. Applicant applied for a 20-year Permit. The Amended Application consists of responses from the Applicant incorporating mitigation measures as per the Community Impact Assessment, and demonstrates compliance with, or an intent to comply with, requirements of the New Mexico Solid Waste Rules; facility management plans, including an operations plan, waste screening/inspection plan, emergency contingency plan, transportation plan, and facility closure plan; documentation confirming the existence of a financial assurance mechanism for facility closure; and documentation of the Applicant’s performance of public notice.

Hearing Date, Time, and Location: The hearing will begin at 5:30 pm on May 21, 2026, and will be conducted both virtually via Webex (see the link posted online in the Department’s Calendar at www.env.nm.gov/events-calendar/) and in person at the following physical location in the City of Albuquerque in Bernalillo County, New Mexico: Sheraton Albuquerque Airport Hotel, 2910 Yale Blvd SE, Albuquerque, New Mexico 87106. An Information Technology specialist and a Department staff member will be available to assist the public to appear and participate in the public hearing virtually and in person.

General, Non-Technical Public Comment: The Hearing Officer will accept general, non-technical public comment, including relevant evidence, data, views, arguments, written statements, and public comment, in two ways:

- Members of the public may choose to participate during the public comment portion of the hearing by providing oral general, non-technical public comment. Members of the public who wish to orally provide general, non-technical public comment at the public hearing shall notify the WebEx host through the chat feature, and they will be sworn in at an appropriate time during the hearing. Each member of the public

will have up to five (5) minutes to offer general, non-technical public comment.

- In addition, or alternatively, members of the public may choose to participate at any time, starting now, until the hearing record is closed, by submitting written general, non-technical public comment on the Department's Public Comment Portal via a link on the Department's docketed matters web page www.env.nm.gov/opf/docketed-matters/. Look under the Environment Department Cabinet Secretary dropdown for SWB 24-08 Broadway Transfer Station, scroll down and click "Submit Comments Here". Technical Testimony or Interested Party Participation: In contrast to general, non-technical public comment, technical testimony cannot be presented without pre-filing documents as described in this paragraph. Technical testimony means scientific, engineering, economic or other specialized testimony, whether oral or written, but does not include legal argument, general comments or statements of policy concerning matters at issue in the hearing. A person wishing to present technical testimony at the hearing must file a Notice of Intent to Present Technical Testimony, and a person wishing to be an interested party must file an Entry of Appearance, with Hearing Clerk Luis Lopez, P.O. Box 5469, 1190 St. Francis Drive, S-2103, Santa Fe, NM 87502, telephone (505) 490-0186, Luis.Lopez@env.nm.gov, and serve it upon other parties of record, by no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 1, 2026.

Hearing Procedures: The public hearing will be conducted in accordance with the Permit Procedures of the Environment Department (20.1.4 NMAC). Post-Hearing Procedures: After the conclusion of the hearing, the Secretary of Environment shall issue, with conditions, or deny, solid waste facility permits in accordance with the Act. The Secretary of Environment will consider all public comments, including issues relating to public health and welfare, in his decision to issue, issue with conditions, or deny, the permit.
