Peabody Natural Resources Company (PNRC) invites public comment on a draft Use Attainability Analysis (UAA) and proposed changes to the surface water quality standards for San Isidro Arroyo and tributaries, McKinley County, New Mexico.

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) establishes designated uses and surface water quality standards for all waters of the state. The waters within the San Isidro Arroyo watershed that are unclassified have designated uses of livestock watering, wildlife habitat, primary contact, and marginal warm water aquatic life. The waters within the San Isidro Arroyo watershed that were classified as ephemeral by NMED in 2013 have designated uses of livestock watering, wildlife habitat, secondary contact, and limited aquatic life.

Peabody Natural Resources Company (PNRC) invites public comment on the draft Use Attainability Analysis (UAA) and proposed changes to the surface water quality standards for San Isidro Arroyo and tributaries, McKinley County, New Mexico.

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) establishes designated uses and surface water quality standards for all waters of the state. The waters within the San Isidro Arroyo watershed that are unclassified have designated uses of livestock watering, wildlife habitat, primary contact, and marginal warm water aquatic life. The waters within the San Isidro Arroyo watershed that were classified as ephemeral by NMED in 2013 have designated uses of livestock watering, wildlife habitat, secondary contact, and limited aquatic life.

A UAA is a scientific study conducted for the purpose of assessing the factors affecting the attainment of a designated use. PNRC conducted a UAA on waters within the San Isidro Arroyo watershed that relied on methods outlined in the NMED *Hydrology Protocol* for identifying ephemeral and intermittent waters. Based on the findings of the UAA, PNRC is proposing to classify the San Isidro Arroyo and tributaries as ephemeral in the State Water Quality Standards for Interstate and Intrastate Surface Waters (NMAC 20.6.4). The Draft UAA and the proposed water quality standards amendment are available for public inspection at the McKinley County Courthouse, County Clerk's Office, 201 W. Hill, Gallup New Mexico; and the Mother Whiteside Public Library, 1101 N First St., Grants, New Mexico.

- CONFERENCE ROOM: A traditional conference room with one large table that sits 15 office chairs. Food and drink ARE allowed (see rules below), and the room is equipped with a television/DVD player/sound bar setup.
- 2. **READING ROOM/CLASSROOM**: This 20-seat room resembles a traditional library reading room with oak tables and chairs available for use. NO food or drink allowed.
- COURTYARD: The Courtyard is separate from the Library proper and seats more than 50 individuals comfortably. Expect traffic to and from the Library through this area. Food and drink ARE allowed.

Rules for Use of a Library Facility

Fees:

Meetings/events lasting between two and four hours require a fee of \$10 and meetings/events lasting
more than four hours require a fee of \$25, per day. City entities can use facilities at no charge, but
all other rules apply.

Food and Drink:

 Food and drink are allowed in the conference room and courtyard but will need to be discussed and cleared with Library Director or Assistant Librarian. The Library does not provide any type of food equipment (coffee machine, etc.) nor any type of food supplies (water, snacks, etc.)

Setup and Clean Up:

The event organizer is responsible for set-up and general clean-up of the facility. Trash should be thrown in provided receptacles, and if applicable, spills or messes beyond normal use should be dealt with prior to leaving.

Availability:

 Room reservations are taken and approved on a first come, first served basis and MUST BE CONFIRMED by the Library Director or other designated staff **PRIOR** to your meeting/event. Rooms are only available during regular Library hours, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
