Air Quality Operating Permit
for Milagro Gas Treating Plant of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Milagro Gas Treating Plant. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.735944, -107.941694 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 3 mi northeast of Bloomfield in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P101R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1277.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of this natural gas treating plant is to remove carbon dioxide and other contaminants from natural gas.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves renewing existing Title V Permit.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere, from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows. The facility is a major source, >100,000 tpy CO₂e, of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 33, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Db, and IIII; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before March 16, 2026.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P101 by contacting Miranda Baldwin at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816, or by email at miranda.baldwin1@env.nm.gov. Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
