



Did you know?

That between 2012-2018 that Eddy County alone provided and estimated \$6.4 Billion in revenues to the State budget.

Did you know?

That the \$6.4 Billion was distributed to State programs- and then disbursed to New Mexico Counties, including yours- as follows:

Education \$3.2 Billion

Health and Human Services \$1.9 Billion

Highway and Transportation \$4.2 Million

Public Safety \$351 Million

Judicial \$226 Million

Culture, Recreation, and Natural Resources \$120 Million

Other Government Programs \$228 Million

Total \$6.4 Billion

Did you know?

The reason Eddy County was able to contribute so much revenue to those programs is due to the very large extraction industry in Eddy County. Eddy County continues to be the top County per capita contributor to the State Budget.

Did you know?

The tax revenues that flow to the State are then distributed to Counties, including yours...

Did you know?

The proposed changes to the rules that apply to the extraction industry, mostly impacting Eddy and Lea Counties, will greatly impact revenues to counties, including yours...

And finally.... Do you know?

How you are going to replace that lost revenue in your budget?

The figures below reflect revenues distributed to each County that were generated from oil and gas production in New Mexico. The majority of those funds go directly to support education. The figures represent revenues from peak production levels this past year in southeast New Mexico, where more than 90% of those revenues are generated. Because of the amount of production on federal lands, the associated revenues represent 57% of the total generated. Should the policies implemented by recent Executive Orders stay in place, or other legislative measures be implemented that affect those operations, there will be a direct impact on the production volumes and the subsequent tax revenues. So the question that remains is: “Do you know how you are going to replace those lost incomes in your budgets?”
